

## **NOTICE TO VOTERS: SPECIAL ELECTION**

**What: Special Election Reconsideration Vote**

**When: Monday May 24th, 2021/ Polls open 10:00am-7:00pm**

**Where: Town Hall, 57 Main Street Montgomery CTR**

### ***Registering to Vote:***

- You may register to vote on Election day by filling out the application form.
  - Register online via “My Voter Page” <https://mvp.vermont.gov/>

### ***I am already a registered Montgomery voter; how can I Vote?***

#### **In Person on Election Day:**

- Arrive at Town Hall between 10:00am-7:00pm to vote and cast your ballot. Masks and social distancing procedures will still be in effect. If you have physical disabilities, are visually impaired or cannot read, you may have assistance from another individual of your choosing.

### ***I will be out of town OR I am unable to come in person that day; how can I vote?***

**\*Early/Absentee- Ballots available starting May 4<sup>th</sup>, 2021\***

- **Option 1: Request your ballot be mailed to your residence via phone, email, or using My Voter Page:** <https://mvp.vermont.gov/>
  - IF you requested an early/absentee ballot for Town Meeting, you do not need to submit a new request, by law we must automatically send you a ballot for this Special Election.
  - IF you DID NOT request an early/absentee ballot for Town Meeting but would like to for this Election you DO need to make a request.
- **Option 2: Vote Early at the Town Office**
  - **First day available May 4<sup>th</sup>**
  - **Last day available May 21<sup>st</sup>**
  - You may vote in the office or take the ballot home. Please note you may only legally take *your own ballot with you*--however you may request that a ballot be mailed to your family member(s)
  - If you have physical disabilities, are visually impaired or cannot read, you may have assistance from another individual of your choosing.
- **Returning Ballots:** Ballots can be returned to the Town Offices in person (starting May 4<sup>th</sup>), submitted to the office drop-box located at 86 Mountain Rd, mailed via USPS, or **handed in directly to an Election Official** on election day up until 7:00pm.

\*If you plan to vote Early/Absentee your ballot will be processed on Election Day by two Election Officials like all other absentee ballots under regular Election Procedures (the November General Election was given exception due to Covid-19 outbreaks and Statewide mail in procedures). Your ballot will be checked in, removed from the certificate envelope, and submitted into the ballot box with all other ballots to ensure anonymity.

NO PERSON SHALL:

- ! Vote more than once per election, either in the same town or in different towns.
- ! Mislead the board of civil authority about your own or another person's true residency or other eligibility to vote.
- ! Hinder or impede a voter going into or from the polling place.
- ! Socialize in a manner that could disturb other voters in the polling place.
- ! Offer bribe, threaten, or exercise undue influence to dictate or control the vote of another person.

- If you believe that any of your voting rights have been violated, you may file an Administrative Complaint with the Secretary of State's Office, 128 State Street, Montpelier, VT 05633.
- If you believe you have witnessed efforts to commit any kind of fraud or corruption in the voting process, you may report this to your local United States Attorney's Office. If you have witnessed acts of discrimination or intimidation in the voting process, you may report this to the Civil Rights Division of the United States Department of Justice at (800) 253-3931
