Saturday, July 15th is the twentieth anniversary of the Flood of '97. On this day, several Town organizations are pausing to remember and reflect upon that terrifying night and especially how the town came together afterward to help each other clean up and recover.

The Library and the Friends of the Library will be starting the day off with coffee, tea, and a piece of pie served from 8:30AM to 1:00PM at the Montgomery Town Library outside-- weather permitting. Donations will be accepted.

Down the road in the Village, the Montgomery Historical Society will be hosting a display at Pratt Hall from 9AM to 3:00PM featuring photo -documentation, command center reports, and video footage of the disaster.

From 2:00PM to 4:00PM, the Montgomery Center for the Arts will have its doors open and be serving ice cream to commemorate the locale of the flood head-waters and the devastating wash-out that initiated at the Route 118 Bridge.
