# HAZEN'S NOTCH CONSERVATION TRUST (HNCT)

We are pleased to introduce the Hazen's Notch Conservation Trust (HNCT), a local non-profit land trust with a focus on the conservation of forests, wildlife habitats, natural areas, farmland, soil and water resources, undeveloped open space, and non-motorized recreational trails in the Town of Montgomery.

Montgomery has benefited enormously from the conservation of numerous, high elevation forest tracts by the Green Mountain Club, the Vermont Land Trust and The Nature Conservancy. These large parcels form a vital core of significant conservation land in our area; however, most local land ownership consists of smaller parcels. These smaller parcels are critical to the quality of natural resources, ecological health, and scenic beauty of Montgomery and the surrounding area.

A local land trust provides owners of moderate to smaller land parcels an opportunity to conserve their properties in a way that meets their needs and preserves the natural landscape for the future. These conserved lands also provide the public with opportunities for low-impact recreation while enjoying nature's beauty.

The HNCT is working with local landowners and collaborating with other conservation organizations to identify opportunities for protecting important natural areas. The HNCT is a 501(c) 3 nonprofit, charitable organization. ### **GRAND OPENING IN JUNE : EVERGREEN FOUNDATION BIRCHWOOD PUBLIC GARDEN**

The Birchwood, Vermont's newest public garden, opens for the first time June 9-11, when almost 700 of its more than 1,200 rhododendrons will be in bloom. Named for its hundreds of white birches, the naturalistic seven-acre garden on Hazen's Notch Road also offers stunning close views of the northernmost Green Mountains. The Brichwood was created by landscape designer Robert Gillmore, who donated it to the non-profit Evergreen Foundation in 2022. Open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. each day, the Birchwood will be described by interpretive signs along a half-mile of paths. The Birchwood Opening benefits the non-profit FRIENDS OF THE MONTGOM-ERY TOWN LIBRARY. Admission is \$7 per person, children 12 and under are FREE, no dogs or pets allowed to preserve the delicate landscaping. Gardens are not wheelchair accessible, but are gently graded. ### HISTORICAL EXHIBIT

FRIENDS OF THE MONTGOMERY TOWN LIBRARY presents an exhibit of images and text on the life of General Montgomery displayed in the halls of the PSB. The town of Montgomery was named for Major General Richard Montgomery, who was killed in the American Revolution. A colorful new exhibit on his "short, ironic life" has been mounted in the town Public Safety Building on Mountain Road. Montgomery was killed while leading the American assault on the British fortress of Quebec in a raging blizzard in December, 1775. This exhibit recounts Montgomery's short ironic life in eight 11-by-17-inch wall panels illustrated with historic pictures of the general and photographs of Montgomery Place, the estate built by his widow on the Hudson River, in New York. A full-size reproduction of the dramatic oil painting, *The Death of Montgomery in the Attack on Quebec, December 31, 1775*, by John Trumbull, the so-called "painter of the Revolution" whose subjects included George Washington and other Founding Fathers, is also on exhibit. The exhibit may be viewed whenever the library (802-326-3113) or the town clerk's office (802-326-4719) are open. The exhibit is free but donations to support the library are welcome.
